DESERVING SENIORS AWARDED \$32,000 IN SCHOLARSHIPS

Our annual Scholarship Dinner became a Saturday afternoon barbecue this year, where we had a beautiful day, a fine crowd, and a well catered meal. All of our scholarship winners were present, many of them accompanied by various family members. Since we long ago combined the scholarship presentations with our naming of the year's Distinguished Alumni Award winner, we were honored to hear from CLIFF LAMBERT '69, who spoke warmly of his days at SBHS. Lambert also focused on his commitment to the community through the Endowment For Youth Program and his many hours he spent as Supervisor of Youth Activities in the city. His remarks were a most appropriate commentary to encourage commitment to service for our graduates.

We present a brief descriptions of our scholarship winners below, along with the name of the scholarship they won.
