



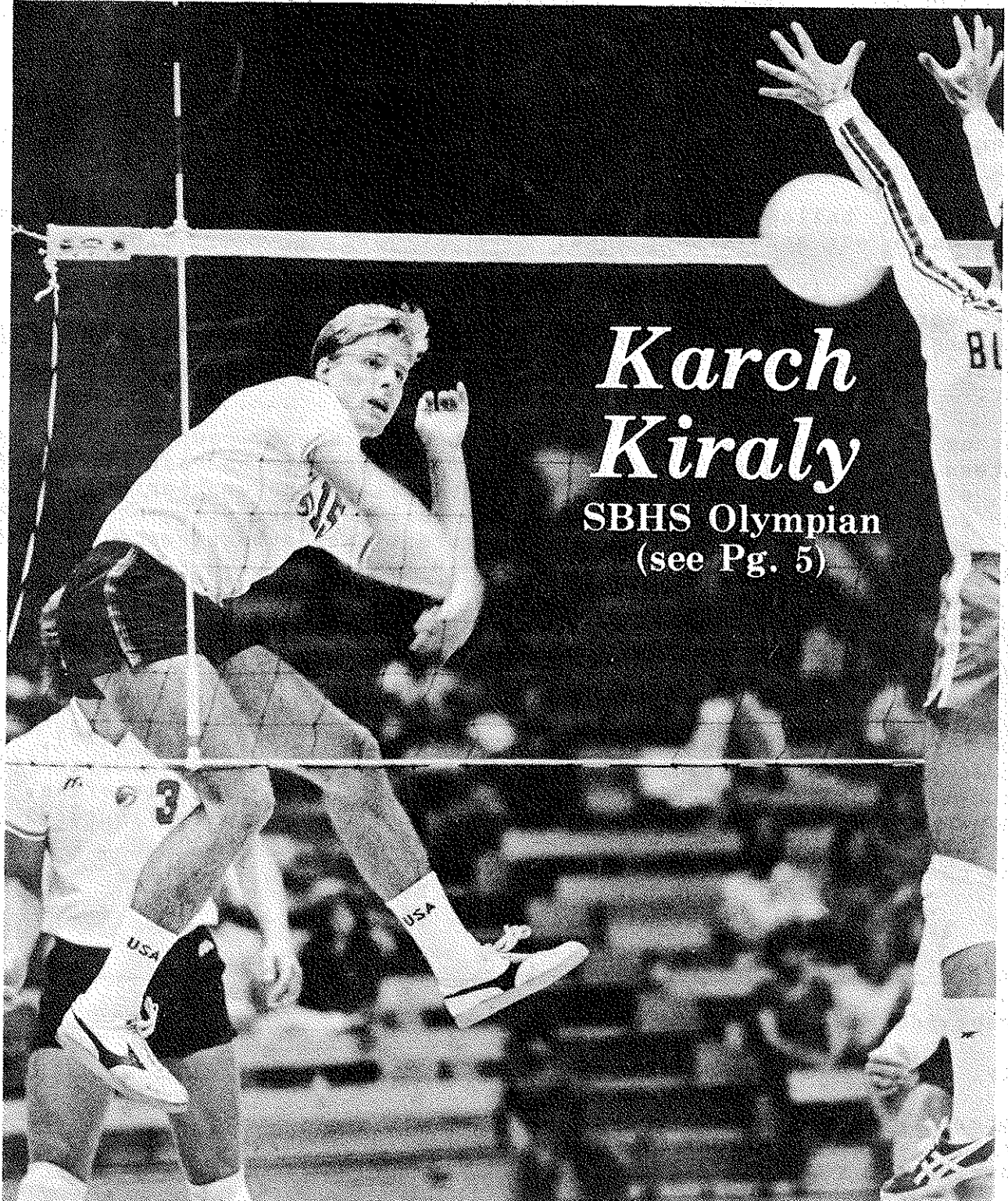

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

This is my last newsletter to you as your president. I feel that these past four years have been very productive, and I would like to review the high points.

Since our scholarship program began in 1976, we have aided 71 graduates of Santa Barbara High School with \$23,665. (These figures do not include 1984). Most of this money has been donated by our members; some has come from membership dues and from special projects of our 18-member board. We honor these young scholars at our dinner dances held each May.

Our membership has grown to over 2500.

Through the fall barbecues we have raised \$610 for the Activities Scholarship Trust, which goes to help students who cannot otherwise afford to participate in athletics, drama, and music.

New trees were planted to replace the diseased trees near the tennis courts off Nopal Street.

We are very proud of the front entrance project. The wrought-iron gate, the brick trim, the trees, and the rocks and plantings have done much to enhance the Anapamu entrance.

Our ongoing project of selling T shirts and sweat shirts is still successful.

Our reunion committee continues to help classes with their reunions when our assistance is wanted.

In the past two years we've been pleased to have a number of young alumni on our board. This year four of our board members have been from the classes of the 70's, and we're adding another next year. Their youth and enthusiasm are a shot in the arm for the rest of us.

A growing trend that pleases and inspires us is the giving of scholarships by classes, usually after class reunions. We hope this trend will encourage other classes to make similar contributions.

All in all it has been a rewarding four years for me, with the help of the other officers and board members. As past president I will remain on the board and continue to work for the fulfillment of the aims and goals of the SBHS Alumni Association.

Speaking of goals, one of our aims is to promote fellowship among SBHS graduates. This is a major purpose of our spring dinner dance, to be held May 12 in the Santa Barbara Room of the Miramar Hotel. If you are within traveling distance, please join us. You'll enjoy the food, the fellowship, and the dancing, and you'll be impressed with the caliber of our scholarship recipients.

SBHS OLYMPIANS

Santa Barbara High School will be well represented in the upcoming Summer Olympics at Los Angeles.

Karch Kiraly led the 1978 Dons volleyball team to an undefeated season and CIF Championship. Now he is a starting hitter on the US Olympic Volleyball team. Karch was made a permanent member of the team in 1981.

After graduating from SBHS, Karch went to UCLA. In three of his four years there, the Bruins won the NCAA title. Karch was NCAA tournament MVP twice. A pre-med student, Karch has won the Top Five academic excellence award of the NCAA.

Phillip Pipersburg ('73) will be representing his native country of Belize in the Olympics. As a junior at SBHS, Phillip was track athlete of the year, setting several school records. In 1973 he tied the Easter Relays 100 yard dash record of 9.6.

Born in the former British Honduras, Phillip has lived here since he was 13. After SBHS, he attended SBCC and Cal State Long Beach. In 1976 and 1980 Phillip returned to Belize, attempting to help field that country's first Olympic team, but without success. In January of this year he was notified that he would be a founding member of the Belize Olympic team, entered to run the 200 meters.

Off the field of competition, Peggy Sands Orchowski ('59) will develop and manage the service center in the National Olympic Committee's Olympic Village at UCSB. She will work specifically with team leaders, coaches and athletes from 45 nations participating in rowing, kayaking, and canoeing. Currently she spends much planning time in Los Angeles.

This is a job in which Peggy's foreign background and language experience will be valuable. "I never had a job I enjoyed so much," she said.

SBHS had a roundabout connection with the Winter Olympics. Elizabeth Ann Smith Somners ('59) is the mother of figure-skating silver medal winner Rosalyn Somners.

SANTA BARBARA HIGH -- STILL AN OUTSTANDING SCHOOL
1983-84 has been a year of transition for Santa Barbara High School. Education in California and the rest of the United States has changed considerably in the past two years and will continue to do so. There is a definite raising of expectations for students. The school day is being lengthened; the school year is being lengthened; requirements are being added for all students in order to earn a diploma.

An outstanding staff is continuing to meet the challenge. This campus has been so successful in preparing young men and women for the next step in their lives that an overload of students has been the result. The enrollment is back up to 2300 students, many of whom have come directly from private schools and other public high schools in the area. Today's students generally are more serious about their education and behave themselves better than those of a few years ago. If you visit the campus, drop by to see the many course changes and the use of modern technology (particularly in the areas of television and micro-computers) to bring the program up to date.

The school district has refurbished the entry hall. Everyone returning has noted the bright colors and the beauty that has been brought out. Every effort is being made to maintain that beauty on campus even though support staff has been severely curtailed.

Several long-time faculty members will be retiring at the end of this year. Prominent among them are Sam Cathcart, Ev Crist, Jim McDermott, and Tito Gorrindo. Together they represent over 100 years of service to the Santa Barbara City Schools.

As the school year begins to wind down, we anticipate a large number of scholarships for an outstanding class. Once again the SBHS Alumni Association is to be thanked for its generous contribution of scholarships to worthy students.

Make it a point to visit your alma mater when you can. Santa Barbara High still ranks as one of the outstanding high schools in California.
